The Art of Edo Japan

Students will design and create a block print, practice Japanese calligraphy, learn and create animals in origami, learn the significance of "Tea" and create a contemporary mixed media screen based on Japanese legends.

Campers will be instructed in a fused glass project in place of Pottery on Friday. Glass Fusing is the art of layering pieces of glass and then firing them in a kiln. Once fired, the glass is permanently fused together. Using colored glass pieces, glass dots, glass frit (sprinkles) and glass noodles students will create unique and colorful design.
